## **REPORTS:**

- 3.1 Pendleton Heights High School Principal Connie Rickert presented Pendleton Heights High School's annual academic report as reflected in the school district's Students First Strategic Plan. Mrs. Rickert shared Pendleton Heights High Schools Core Goals of Success for all students, and Core Goal of at Least 90% of Students Pass Language Arts/English and Mathematics on State Assessments. Mrs. Rickert proudly announced PHHS received a Grade "A" from the Indiana Department of Education and reviewed PHHS School Grade History from 2012 through 2018, ISTEP+ for Grade 10 E/LA which showed a decline in score; however, still above state average, Math scores fell below state average, College and Career Readiness increased from 2017 to 65%, SAT Performance above state average for the seventh year in a row and above national average for the past five years, ACT Performance above state and national average for the 11<sup>th</sup> year in a row. Mrs. Rickert reported on student attendance rates are at or above the state average for the past six years and graduation rate at 94.9%, and above state average. Mrs. Rickert shared Advanced Placement at PHHS for 362 total students, Dual Credits from 2009 of 243 credits and 4 classes to currently 2,188 credits and 14 classes, reviewed 2018 Performance Benchmark Goal Summary.
